**RESOLUTION NO. 2020-6**

**AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION AMENDING THE MANDATORY ORDERS RELATING  
TO PUBLIC GATHERINGS CONTAINED IN ORDINANCE #710**

**WHEREAS**, the City adopted an emergency ordinance pursuant to SDCI 9-29-1 and 9-32-1 which implement social distancing guidelines recommended by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) to stop the outbreak of the disease COVID-19; and,

**WHEREAS**, the emergency ordinance provides that it shall remain in effect until such time as it is amended, suspended, reinstated or repealed by Resolution of the Miller City Council; and,

**WHEREAS**, the number of COVID-19 cases in Hand County and surrounding counties have remained relatively low; and,

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of social distancing requirements is to slow the spread of the disease so that the local health care system is not overwhelmed; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City has been in communication with Avera Hand County Hospital who has modeling that allows them to make predictions on the impact of certain social distancing regulations on the number of cases in the area and the overall impact on the health care system; and,

**WHEREAS**, based on the number of cases in Hand County and the surrounding areas, and the available modeling, the Mayor and City Council believe some of the social distancing restrictions can be modified to allow businesses to resume on-site service of customers without causing the number of cases in the City to rise to the level that it will overwhelm the hospital's capacity if proper procedures are put in place.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City of that the following regulations be put in place to control the spread of COVID-19:

1. Any businesses that were ordered to close pursuant to paragraphs 1 and 2 of Ordinance #710 may reopen to serve patrons on-site under the guidelines, protocols, procedures and/or practices established by the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and SD Department of Health, incorporated herein by reference, and any applicable state regulations or Executive Orders.
2. This Resolution shall remain in effect until such time as it is amended, suspended, or repealed by Resolution of the Miller City Council.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the City of Miller, that due to the fact a national and statewide emergency has been declared and one for the primary recommendations to combat this emergency is to practice social distancing and limit person-to-person contact, this resolution is considered necessary for the immediate preservation for the public peace, health, and safety of the City of Miller and shall be effective at 2:00 a.m. on May 13, 2020.
